Ages 6-11 years old (child must be 6 by the first class)

Class Sessions Offered: Tuesdays 9:30am-11:30am, Tuesdays 1:30pm-3:30pm, Thursdays 9:30am-11:30am or Thursdays 1:30pm-3:30pm

January 14th or 16th Winter Ecology

Winter seems like a quiet time in nature but here in New Jersey there are many species that have adapted to the winter weather. During this class we'll traverse the farm to learn what strategies the plants and animals have developed to endure the winter elements. We'll discover which animals migrate, go dormant, hibernate or stay active and why.

January 21st or 23rd Winter Birds

Some bird species take flight to warmer homes for the winter but birds that remain have amazing survival tactics for New Jersey winters. We'll learn where to look for winter birds, what they eat and how to enjoy observing them throughout the cold months. In order for the students to continue observing the winter birds we will create our own bird feeders for home observation

Food Webs & Food Chains

January 28th or 30th

What is a food web? What is a food chain? How are they similar, and how are they different? The students will be able to answer all of these questions and more after our class. Collectively, the students will use their scientific knowledge of Fernbrook's ecosystems and the native species that inhabit New Jersey along with their creative minds to create various food webs and food chains!

All Things from Trees

February 4th or 6th

Did you know that trees provide us with more than 5,000 products that people use every day? During this class we will understand how products such as paint, toothpaste, tires, and cake frosting are related to trees. The students will leave the class with a better understanding of how to help conserve forests and trees for future generations.

Orienteering & Cartography February 11th or 13th

With GPS today, less people attempt to develop a good sense of direction, but we never know when technology will leave us stranded. After this class, students can be proud of their map and compass skills. They will explore 230acres of the farm following bearings and observing their topography to find their way with maps. Students will also learn a few of nature's directional clues to prevent them from getting turned around when exploring.

Wilderness Safety & Survival Skills

February 18th or 20th

Being safe during outdoor excursions and activities is important, and being prepared for any situation helps nature lovers feel comfortable in their travels. Students will learn what to take on an afternoon hike or a 3-day camping trip, then how to safely use the tools to prevent injury and sickness. The group will encounter multiple scenarios that will challenge their survivals skills.

Patterns in Nature

February 25th or 27th

Here at Fernbrook we are always amazed by the beauty of nature, but we sometimes miss the most marvelous details. We will spend this class discovering winter patterns and shapes in the trees, snow, clouds, ice and all part of nature. The students will take some time to quietly observe all the little miracles provided by Mother Earth and appreciate the designs and delicate features around the farm.

Farm Animal Husbandry

March 3rd or 5th

During our last class of the semester the students will get up close and personal with all of the Fernbrook farm animals. We will learn about the specific needs each animals has for a healthy life; bedding, nutrition, space, exercise and interaction. Classes will discuss medical issues we need to be aware of and preventative measure to keep the animals free of sickness, happy, and healthy!
